Wilderness Wandering

A number of you asked for the source of the poem I used at Holy Trinity on Sunday morning during my sermon. I must confess that I had not come across the poem or the poet before, but that it came to me via Facebook from my former colleague Joe Moore who is leading our Quiet Day on Saturday 2nd March (you can still book).

I thought I would share it with you all as my contribution to the newsletter this week. It's called *The Wilderness is the place where we are brave* and it is by a poet called Sarah Are, a Presbyterian Minister in New York.

First, we have to name it The heartbreak,
The addiction,
The shame,
The grief.

Whatever your wilderness is, First we have to name it.

And once we've said those words out loud, We let that truth hang in the air. And we let ourselves feel what we feel, For in this moment, we are close to the surface.

And after a few deep breaths, We begin the removing. Piece by piece, we take our armour off, For truth-telling days are Soft skin kind of days. And once we are armour-free,
Hearts on our sleeves
And tears in our throats,
We stand toe-to-toe
With the very hurt that wrecked us.
And we don't try to swallow that pain away.

And there,
In all our beautiful God-given honesty,
We say to that monster,
"I have love on my side,
And her name is God,
And no wilderness can separate me
From that north star."

And I believe
It will be the bravest thing you ever do.
And your knees might shake,
And you might lose your way,
But our God is a God of second chances,
So take my hand.
You are close to the surface.
Let's be brave together.

Poems are often spoiled by being explained, especially by preachers, so I will resist that temptation (it's Lent, after all!). For me it prompts questions: what is it that I dare not name, and who is it that I can be brave with? What questions does it prompt in you?

Lent is a time where, if we can find it within ourselves to be a little bit brave, we can learn to let some of our own wilderness be exposed to the God who goes into the wilderness in Jesus Christ.
